

## **The Loseby Family**

### **Philip Thorpe**

#### **Part Two**

This is a continuation of the article in *Discovering the Wolds* available online as a PDF ([www.hoap.co.uk/who/loseby family 01.pdf](http://www.hoap.co.uk/who/loseby%20family%2001.pdf)). In this second part Phil describes the ancestors and descendants of the people shown in the photograph taken on 25th March 1901.

Note: Deaths recorded in the Leicester Central District are probably people who died in Leicester Royal Infirmary.

#### **William and Charlotte Loseby**

William Loseby was born 1781 in Saxby (Leicestershire) to William and Mary Loseby, and baptised 17th June 1781. He may have married Charlotte Haynes on 22nd November 1810 in Thrussington. Charlotte was born in 1790 to John and Susannah Haynes in Thrussington then baptised on 27th February 1790. Both died after 1851. At some point – perhaps in search of work – they moved to Wymondham, certainly by 1813, where all the children were born. As far as is known, William was an agricultural labourer, and his ancestors most probably were. There are no Loseby gravestones in Wymondham churchyard, and the only one in Saxby is that of Mary Loseby, who died in 1827 age forty-two. Is she one of their children, or William and Mary Loseby? I think both died before 1837, before registration came in.

The children were:

John Loseby born 1813, died 1813.

Mary Loseby born 1814, died Wymondham 1842?

John Loseby born 1817, died ?

William Loseby born 1818, died before 1820?

William Loseby born 1820 Wymondham, and died 4th February 1904 at Stanford on Soar.

Charlotte Loseby born 1822, and baptised 27th March 1822 at Wymondham, and died Wymondham 1852, unmarried.

Susanah Loseby born 1823 and baptised 15th February 1824 at Wymondham, and died Wymondham 1825.

Frederick Loseby born 1826, died autumn 1869 at Prestwold, and is buried there.

Eliza Shirley Loseby born 1828, died after 1861. She is shown in the 1861 census as a 'housekeeper' for William Hack in Burton Lazars.

Henrietta Loseby born 1830, baptised 14th June 1830 at Wymondham, and died Wymondham 1831.

There is a record of a marriage of William Loseby to Jane Loseby 24th May 1829, but I do not know how he fits in.

### **William and Mary Loseby**

William Loseby was born 1751 in Saxby to John and Mary Loseby, and married Mary Marriot or Maret 27th November 1780 in St Peter's, Saxby. In the parish register the name is sometimes spelt 'Loasby', due to being written down from the spoken word, and the people providing the information not being literate. The children were all born in Saxby, there may have been others, as yet not found. Their dates of death are not as yet known.

Mary may have died quite young as there is a record of a widower William Loseby marrying Jane Ashwell on 28th March 1799 at Stapleford.

The children were:

Sarah Loseby born 1782, baptised 1st Decemeber 1782 at Saxby, and married John Pacey 18/12/1828.

Mary Loseby born 1784, baptised Saxby 5th December 1784, and died Saxby unmarried 1827.

William Loseby born 1781, baptised 17th June 1781 in Wymonham, and married Charlotte Haynes in Thrussington 27th February 1790.

Samuel Loseby born 1787, baptised Saxby 18th July 1787.

Anne Loseby born 1790, baptised Saxby 04/07/1790.

John Loseby born 1792, baptised 18th March 1792, died Saxby 1828.

He first married Catherine Patchet of Knipton 25th July 1825, but she died. He then married Ann Gunby on 28th October 1828, the record shows him as a 'widower'.

Jane Loseby born ?, married William Jackson 24th March 1829.

### **John and Mary Loseby**

John Loseby was born in Saxby in 1726 to William and Mary Loasby. He married Mary Allen (who was born about 1729) on 16th November 1749 in St Peter's, Saxby. Mary died between 1757 and 1759, presumably at Saxby. As well as William, born 1751, there was Francis Loseby, who died in 1771 at Saxby, and Mary Loseby, born 1757, dying the same year. There must have been others not as yet found.

There are records of John Loseby marrying Mary Trentham at Stapleford 23rd October 1780, and Ann Loseby marrying Edward Page in Melton 6th September 1773. These could be son and daughter.

### **William and Mary Loasby**

William Loasby was born at Saxby in April 1689, but his date of death not known. He married Mary (surname unknown), who perhaps died September or November 1716. William may have re-married or Mary died later. The Saxby parish register book is difficult to read.

Their children, all born in Saxby, were:

Frances Loasby who married John Pheasant 2nd Decemeber 1739 in  
St Peter's, Saxby.

Ann Loasby born September 1715, baptised 24th September 1715.

William Loseby, baptised 8th June 1718.

John Loasby, born 1726.

Elizabeth Loasby, born 1720, married John Freeman (a widower who  
was born at Stapleford) on 17th April 1754 in St Peter's, Saxby.

John Loasby, married Mary (surname unknown) who died 1726.

Mary Loasby born about 1720, and married John Steins of Stonesby  
27th March 1740 in St Peter's, Saxby.

### **William and Ann Loasby**

William Losby was born in the seventeenth century to William Loasby and his wife (name unknown). His wife may have been called Ann, also born in the seventeenth century. There is a record of William Losebie marrying Anne Cobley on 8th September 1652 in Twyford cum Thorpe Satchville, but this could be an earlier generation. The dates of death are not known.

Their children, all born at Saxby, were:

Rush Losby born 16??, married Ann?? Their son John was baptised  
16th September 1699, daughter Mary born 12th January 1704,  
baptised 19th January 1704, died and buried 18th November  
1762 or 1763.

Richard Losby born 16??, married Mary?? Their daughter Elizabeth  
was baptised 19th September 1697.

William Losby baptised 14the April 1689, and married Mary??.

Ann Losby born October 1693, baptised 29the October 1693.

Mary Losby May born 1692, baptised 1st June 1692.

Catherine Losby born April 1700, baptised 17th April 1700.

There may also have been a daughter Frances, who married John Watts a labourer in Melton on 15th January 1704.

## **William and ?? Loasby**

William Losby's birth is unknown but he died May or June 1683, and was buried on 4th June 1683. The marriage of a William Losebie to Anne Cobley in 1652 (see above) may be theirs. They may have had a son James who married Dorothy Neal at Little Dalby on 17th January 1688. There are records of possible daughters marrying. Mary Loseby married John Arnott in Melton 13th November 1686, and Katherine Loseby to Will Robinson in Little Dalby on 6th November 1690. There is also a record of Elizabeth Loseby marrying Henry Greene in Melton Mowbray on 17th November 1640, but she could be a previous generation.

Also in the parish records are Henrie Losebee, who married Mary Tilley at Twyford on 28th November 1609, and Grace Loosbee was baptised at Twyford on 18th November 1592.

## **Samuel and Elizabeth Savage**

Samuel Savage was born in 1815 in Great Ponton (Lincolnshire), being baptised there 29th October 1815, to William and Ester Savage. He was married to Elizabeth Isaac on 28th September 1840 by Reverend Thomas Plackett at Harlaxton parish church. The marriage certificate shows both Elizabeth (maiden name Isaacs) and Samuel as 'servants', and living in Hungerton cum Wyville. Samuel is stated to be 25 years old.

Elizabeth, who had to make her mark 'X', is stated to be age twenty-two. She was born in Croxton Kerrial to William and Ester Savage and baptised there on 3 January 1818. Her father was also a 'servant'. There is a hall at Hungerton, but perhaps they all worked at Harlaxton Manor, which was completed in 1840, this large stately home would have required a large number of staff to run it.

Witnesses were Elizabeth's father William and James Fuller(?), there is no mention of Samuel's father, perhaps he had died before September 1837.

The parish register for St Sebastian's, Great Gonerby (Lincolnshire) shows the burial of a William Savage on 11th April 1833, at the age fifty-three. The age and period are about right, and Great Gonerby is not far from Great Ponton. Ester died spring 1848 ('Free BMD' shows her name as 'Hester').

Children were:

William Savage, born 1841 (according to the 1841 census) and died young.

Ann Savage, born summer 1842

Isaac Savage born 1843

Mary Savage born winter 1848

Elizabeth born 1850–1

Richard born 1855

Jane Ester Savage born 29th October 1857 in Great Ponton. Samuel is shown on her birth certificate as an 'agricultural labourer'.

Samuel Savage, born 1870, and William Savage, born 1871, both died before their first birthdays.

The 1841 census shows Samuel, age twenty-five, wife Elizabeth, age twenty, and son William, under one-year old, living at 'Back Street, Spitalgate Houghton and Walton, Grantham.

The marriage certificate for Jane, who married George Loseby in Prestwold on 6th March 1878, shows Samuel as a 'shepherd'. The 1861 census shows the family living in Great Ponton (address not given). There is Samuel, age forty-six and an 'agricultural labourer'; Elizabeth, forty-five; Isaac, fifteen and a 'carter'; Mary, twelve; Elizabeth, ten; Richard, six; and Jane E., three. All the children were born in Ponton, so the family had been there since 1843, and the younger children are shown as 'scholars', including Jane, only three years old. The 1881 census also shows a John Savage and 'agricultural labourer' age fifty-three with his family living in Navenby (Lincolnshire). He was born in Great Ponton, so is probably a brother of Samuel.

The 1881 census shows Samuel, Elizabeth, and the unmarried Isaac living at 1 Barracks Yard, Great Ponton. Both Samuel and Isaac are shown as 'agricultural labourers'. I have not been able to locate Barracks Yard on maps of Great Ponton as yet, so it has probably been demolished. The 1871 census also shows them living at Ponton, but the 1891 census shows Elizabeth living alone on Water Lane, Great Ponton. Elizabeth died spring 1898, Isaac summer 1886, and Samuel summer 1885 age seventy-one, all in the Grantham District so presumably at Ponton.

Mary Savage married Thomas Gibson in the Grantham District, perhaps at Harlaxton, during the winter of 1878. The 1881 census shows her living on Rice Wood Road, Ropsley (just east of Grantham), an 'agricultural labourer's wife', with four-year old daughter Elizabeth, and one-year old son William. Husband Thomas, a 'shepherd', is at the farm of Richard Hill, (presumably his employer), also in Ropsley. The census shows Thomas being born in Ropsley. I think Thomas died summer 1913, age sixty-nine, and Mary died autumn 1922, at the age of seventy-nine, both in the Grantham District.

Elizabeth's mother was called Jane, and died in the Grantham District winter 1874, age seventy-seven. Deaths of two people called William Isaac in the same district are recorded in autumn 1851 and 1856, but no ages are shown. Elizabeth appears to have had at least three brothers, James born 1830, John born 1839, and Daniel born 1844, all at Wyville. They all are shown on the 1881 census living in Hungerton cum Wyville.

### **William and Jane Isaac**

William Isaac was born about 1792 in North Raucby (Lincolnshire), parents unknown. His wife Jane was born in Croxton Kerrial about 1799, parents unknown. The 1851 census shows William and family living in Wyville near Grantham, and William is shown as an 'agricultural labourer'. William is age fifty-nine 59 and Jane fifty-two. Also there is son William, age thirty and born in Skillington (Lincolnshire). The other sons are James, age twenty-one, Bailey, age fourteen, John, age thirteen, and Daniel, age six, all born in



Wyville. There are two daughters, Mary, ten, born in Wyville, and Susanna, either five or six years old, 6 born at Harlaxton. Daughter Elizabeth is not there, having married Samuel Savage in 1840.

Records show a Jane Isaac dying in Grantham district winter 1874 age seventy-seven. Although the age is not quite right, it is probably her. William must be one of the two who such deaths recorded for autumn 1851 or 1856 with ages shown.

### **Luke and Fanny Parker**

Luke Parker was born 1783 (presumed Empingham), to William and Sarah Parker, and married Fanny (Francis?) Mills 14th May 1807, in Empingham. Frances was born in the adjacent village of Whitwell in 1789–90. It would appear they had sons Luke, born 1811 (presumed Empingham); Robert born 1816 and baptised Empingham 11th August 1816; and John, baptised Empingham 21st December 1828. There were also daughters, Sarah, born in Empingham in December 1824, baptised 19th December 1824; Fanny baptised Empingham 7th October 1821; and possibly Mary baptised 21st February 1813.

Sarah married William Loseby at Oakham parish church on 22nd April 1850, the marriage certificate showing Luke as a 'labourer'. There is a record of a Mary Parker marrying George Baker in the Oakham District summer 1840. Sister Sarah stayed with a Mary Parker when her first child George was born. There are two Mary Baker deaths recorded for the Oakham District, autumn 1860, no age given, and autumn 1886, age 73, so born 1813.

The 1861 census shows Luke, age seventy-six, and Frances, age seventy-two, living in Empingham (address not shown). Luke is an 'agricultural labourer' and Frances an 'agricultural labourer's wife'. Luke died in the Oakham District winter 1869, aged eighty-six, and Fanny in winter 1869. One baptism record shows Luke senior as a 'labourer'. The 1861 census shows Robert as an 'ostler', a 'servant' (employee) of farmer Nathaniel Allen in

Empingham, later becoming publican of the Olive Branch Inn in Empingham from 1870 to 1897, though the 1881 census shows him as a farmer with 105 acres employing a labourer and a boy.

Brother Luke died in the Oakham district winter 1876 age sixty-five. The 1861 census shows him in Empingham, aged forty-nine and occupation 'drillman', with wife Jane aged thirty-three. There was a seven-year old stepson, William Bland, so Jane had been married before.

### **William and Sarah Parker**

Luke's parents were I think, William Parker possibly a farmer who married a Sarah?? There was a William Parker baptised in Little Casterton 25th October 1750, parents Robert and Sarah Parker. There was also one baptised in great Dalby Leics in 1752, and Little Bytham 1750. As well as Luke there were, Jane baptised 20th July 1814, Elizabeth baptised 21st January 1816, and William who married a Julia Hannah Sumpter 4th October 1819, all in Empingham. There are most probably others I have not yet found. Father William probably died in the Oakham district (Empingham?) summer 1837, and wife Sarah likewise during the winter of 1840 in the Oakham District.

## **LATER LOSEBY GENERATIONS**

### **George and Jane Loseby**

John H. Loseby was born 1878–9, being shown on the 1881 census, but no subsequent ones. His marriage/death has not been found, but there is a record of a John Loseby dying summer 1920 at the right age, 42, but in the Bradford District. There is a family story of a Loseby dying at sea, but First World War and other records show nothing.

George William Loseby born spring 1879, baptised Prestwold St Andrews 12th October 1879. He married Mary Elizabeth Clarke autumn 1905 in the Melton District. She was born in the Melton District 9th May 1885 and died winter 1970 in Leicester. He died in the Melton District summer 1960 aged 81. In 1911 George, a 'gardener', Mary Elizabeth, Florence Annie, Edith Lilian, and Mabel were at 78 Sydney Street Melton. Also there were two younger sisters of Mary Elizabeth, Annie and Ada Clarke aged 18 and 16, both wool spinners. Perhaps they moved to Fernie Avenue when parents George and Jane moved to Hathern? Their children were:

Florence Annie Loseby, born 1905 (in the Melton District.

Edith Lilian Loseby, born summer 1906 in the Melton District.

Mary or Mabel Loseby, born winter 1908 in the Melton District.

Ada M. Loseby born winter 1911 Melton District and died summer 1912 in the Melton District age 0 years.

George C. Loseby born winter 1915 in the Melton District, he died spring 1933 in the Melton District.

Horace Frederick Loseby born autumn 1917 in the Melton District, he died winter 2003 in the Melton District.

There is another marriage of a George W. Loseby in the Melton District to a Lucy Pick autumn 1916 in the Melton District. This George William was born in Rearsby (which is in the Barrow District) autumn 1884, and I am reasonably certain is not directly related to the Losebys of Stanford. There is also an Annie Loseby born in the Barrow District autumn 1878, but not shown on the 1881 or 1891 census. No death has been found, so perhaps she is related to this George W.?

Robert Loseby, born Walton winter 1880. He married Anna Maria (Marie?) Plowman, who was born in 1882 in Cold Newton, in the Melton District summer 1909. Their children were:

Cecil Robert Loseby, born 17th December 1909 in the Melton District.

He married Florence Emily Davies (Davis?) summer 1945. He

died winter 1988 in Leicester Central District, and she died summer 2002 in the Leicester District, having been born 5th October 1908.

George E. Loseby born summer 1911 in the Melton District, but died soon afterwards.

Frederick William Loseby, born 6th April 1913 in the Melton District. He married Anne Marie Hutchinson summer 1940 in the Louth (Lincs) District, she having been born 7th October 1917 in the Leeds District. They both died in the Durham West District, Frederick in winter 1990, and Marie, spring 2003.

Dorothy A. Loseby was born winter 1916 in the Melton District, and married Benjamin F. Jones in the Melton District winter 1940.

Kathleen A. Loseby was born autumn 1919 in the Melton District, and married James Harrison spring 1942 in the Belper District.

Edith Lilian Loseby was born 28th January 1898 in Sydney Street, Melton. She married Fred Thorpe, born 5th April 1899 in Millbrook Stalybridge, in Hathern parish church 26th March 1921. She died in Hathern summer 1969, and Fred in Huntingdon Court Loughborough 2nd March 1979.

Edith and Fred's children were:

Eva Jane Thorpe, born in Hathern 18th July 1921, baptised 21st August 1921. She married John (Jack) Shephard, a fitter, of 90 Shelthorpe Road, Loughborough 22nd February 1941. They had two sons, David B. born Loughborough 22nd June 1951, and Mark born Loughborough 12th November 1955. Eva died in Loughborough November 1970, and her husband Jack on 17th December 1996. Mark died in Loughborough 25th May 2013.

George Richard (Dick) born in Hathern 24th April 1928, baptised 20th May 1925, marrying Peggy Eileen Button (born Ipswich 26th April 1928) in Loughborough on 12th May 1951. They had a son, Clive born Loughborough winter 1958, and a daughter Wendy born

Loughborough 2nd May 1961. Dick died 25th May 2003 and Peggy on 29th June 2014.

Philip Ernest Robert (Bob) born Hathern 19/05/1925, baptised 14/06/1925 marrying Averil Ursula Simons (born Leicester 03/05/1928). Their four sons born in Loughborough were, Philip James 11/09/1950, Lindsay John 13/11/1955, James Robert 02/07/1958, and Stephen Charles 10/01/1961. Bob died in Leicester (LRI) 19/07/2003.

John Allan, born in Hathern August 1925, marrying Patricia Cooper (born summer 1929 in Loughborough), 16th December 1950 at St Mary's Catholic Church Loughborough. They had a son Richard born Loughborough 30th January 1951, and daughters Caroline born winter 1953 Basford District, Rowena born Basford District winter 1965, and Geraldine born Loughborough winter 1961. John died in the Southampton District 1st December 2000, and Patricia 1st October 1997 in the Loughborough District.

Barrie Thorpe born in Hathern 29th July 1938, married Joyce Hassell (born Nottingham 4th February 1941) in West Bridgeford. They had a daughter Elaine born Nottingham 21st June 1965, a son Peter born Nottingham 2nd April 1968. They now live in Ontario Canada.

Elizabeth Ann Loseby has been covered earlier.

### **Robert and Fanny Loseby**

William (Billy) Loseby was born in Stanford February 1883, being baptised there 14th February. He married Ethel Mary Partridge born summer 1884 (possibly in the South Molton District), in Stanford on 26th December 1911. Ethel died in Stanford 3rd January 1946, but not buried until 1st March. Billy

died in Hathern, aged 84, and was buried at Stanford 27th April. Their children were:

John William Loseby born Stanford, baptised 24th December 1911. He married Phyllis Edith Wright (born Leicester District winter 1911) summer 1935 in the Loughborough District. They lived at Rempstone for some years, later moving to Barleythorpe, Rutland. He died winter 1983 in Nottingham, and is buried at Rempstone, and she died 6th March 1989 in Barleythorpe. Their children were, Jean Kathleen Loseby, born born or baptised 18th December 1938 in Stanford, and Diane Mary Loseby born or baptised 11th June 1949, also in Stanford. Jean married Robert Frank Palmer 31st May 1962 in Rempstone, having two children. Simon Christopher Loseby Palmer, born spring 1966 in Depwade District, and Jennifer St John Palmer born spring 1967 in the Norwich district.

Diane married Michael Raymond Burden 12th September 1970, also in Rempstone, having three children. Nicola Caroline Burden summer 1974 in Leicester Central District, Helen Elizabeth Burden spring 1977 also in Leicester Central, and Jennifer Ruth Burden spring 1981 in Market Harborough District.

Richard Loseby born Stanford, baptised 27th October 1912, buried 29th October 1912, two days later.

Robert Edward Loseby born Stanford, baptised 1st April 1917.

Dorothy Mary Loseby born Stanford, baptised 7th November 1920. She married Thomas Brown (baptised 9th November 1913 at Rempstone), son of Walter and Alice Brown on 20th December 1947 in Stanford. He died in the Nottingham District December 1992, and Dorothy 2nd November 2001 in Normanton on Soar.

## **Robert and Fanny Loseby**

William (Billy) Loseby has been covered earlier.

Sarah Anne Loseby, born September 1884 in Stanford, being baptised 14th September. She married a cousin, John Thomas Loseby, son of John William and Mary Loseby of Normanton 22nd November 1906. Their children were Wilfred Loseby born 1909 in Zouch, Frank Loseby born 3rd March 1909 in Zouch, Betty Irene Loseby born winter 1917 in Normanton. Sarah Anne died in Basford District summer 1956. Wilfred married Gladys M. Mills autumn 1932 in the Loughborough District, their child Diana Mary Loseby was autumn 1933 in Normanton. Wilfred died 22nd January 1972, and is buried at Normanton.

Frank married Beverly Ann Ball (born or baptised 11th October 1919 in the Barrow District) during the autumn of 1937 in the Barrow District. Frank died spring 2006, and Beverly spring 1996, both in the Newark District. They had a daughter, Clement Loseby, born in the Newark District spring 1940. Clement married Michael A. Welch in summer 1971 in the Bishop's Stortford District.

Betty married Stanley Collin from Coalville 12th May 1940 in Normanton.

## **Children of Charles and Eliza Wye (née Loseby)**

Sarah Wye, born or baptised 4th July 1877 in Prestwold. At the time of the 1881 and 1891 census she was staying at Underhill Farm with her grandparents.

Eliza Shirley Wye, born or baptised Prestwold 12th October 1879.

Mary Ellen Wye born or baptised Prestwold 14th June 1881. She married William Percy Oswain summer 1907, and married again later.

Charles William Wye, born or baptised 17th June 1883 in Prestwold. He married Catherine Mary Plummer 23rd June 1908 in Prestwold.

Harry Wye, born autumn 1884 in the Loughborough District, presumably Burton.

Albert Edward Wye born or baptised 22nd August 1886 at Prestwold.

Frederick Wye, born winter 1889 in the Loughborough District, presumably Burton. He married Catherine Louise Smith 3rd March 1911 in Prestwold.

Fanny Wye, born or baptised 24th May 1891 Prestwold.

Edwin Robert Wye, born or baptised 4th November 1894 Prestwold.

### **John William and Mary Loseby:**

Charles William Loseby was born or baptised 19th June 1881 in Prestwold. He married Agnes Roper (born summer 1877 in the Loughborough District). He died 10th January 1956 aged 74, and Agnes died 22nd June 1941; both are buried at Normanton. The 1911 census shows Charles, Agnes, and Dorothy Helen 0 years at Butt Lane Normanton, Charles was a 'farm manager'. Their children were

Dorothy Helen Loseby born or baptised Normanton 17th June 1910, marrying Frank Minton Wardley (born Coventry 1900) 7th October 1933 in Normanton. Dorothy died autumn 2003, and Frank winter 1963, both in Coventry.

Constance Mary Loseby born or baptised 18th May 1913 in Normanton, marrying John Hallam from Castle Donington 17th



February 1934 in Normanton. She died autumn 1986 in the Coalville District.

Sarah Emma Loseby was born or baptised Prestwold 30th July 1882.

She died 9th March 1951, being buried in Normanton on March 9th.

John Thomas Loseby was born or baptised 4th March 1884 in Prestwold. He married cousin Sarah Anne Loseby 22nd November 1906 in Stanford, further details above.

Robert Loseby was born or baptised 3rd May 1885 in Prestwold. He married Olney Doreen Turner 31st May 1930 in Normanton. He died 19th March 1955, and Olney 20th June 1940, both are buried at Normanton. Their child was Robert V. Loseby born spring 1931 in Normanton, and dying an infant in the same quarter.

George Ernest Loseby was born or baptised 5th July 1886 in Prestwold, and died in the autumn aged 0 years, and is buried there.

Fanny Loseby born or baptised 8th April 1888 at Prestwold. She married George Berrington (born 28th October 1893 in Normanton) on 1st August 1925 in Normanton. Fanny died 11th February 1965 in Sutton Bonington, but is buried in Normanton.

Frederick Loseby, born or baptised 28th January 1890 in Burton/Prestwold. It appears he did not marry, and died in the Basford District (Normanton?) 7th February 1961.

Mary Helen Loseby was born summer 1891 in Normanton. She died unmarried 24th March 1967 in Normanton aged 76, and is buried there.
